Prizes will be awarded by our judges and the public can vote for "Peep's Choice" from April 10th-April 15th. Winners will be notified by phone by April 22nd.

Diorama Guidelines:

- Diorama must contain 1 or more Peeps as characters
- You may use any other non-food materials to create your scene or dress Peeps
- Entries must be free standing and shoe box size
- Contents of your diorama should be secure enough to survive being moved
- The library is not responsible for any damage to entry that may occur while displayed
- Print your name and entry category on back of diorama. Title should be on front.
- Entry form gives the library the right to take and publish photos of your entry
- Drop off diorama with entry form [between Saturday April 1st-Saturday April 8th](#)
- Pick up entries between April 24-April 29. After that date, entries will be repurposed.

Pick a scene that people will easily recognize and draw a sketch of how you want the diorama to look

Decorate the box as much as possible. The props and decoration tell the story of your diorama.

You could use wrapping paper or construction paper or print a background to create your scene

Purchase props for your diorama or reuse things you have from home like empty containers and small boxes that can become furniture

You can dress and decorate your Peeps with scraps of fabric or even cupcake liners!

You could use fine tip markers to give them facial expressions or draw on makeup

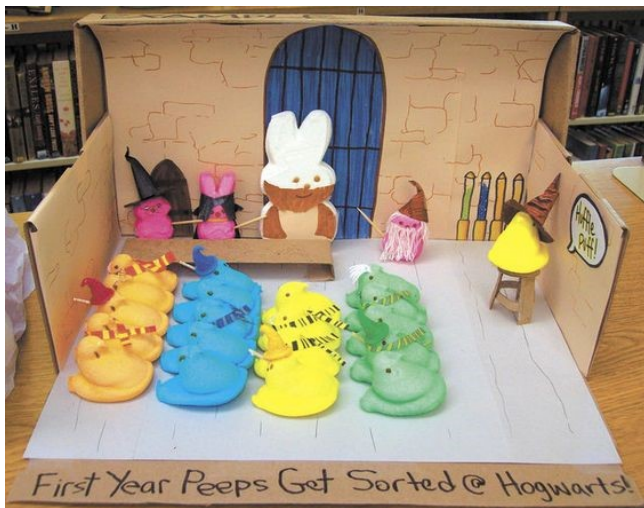

Peeps are easier to work with if you let them sit out for at least a week to harden up. Be careful as they may become more brittle.

To make it easier for your rabbit Peeps to stand, you can cut off the bottoms (before they sit out to dry)

You can use pipe cleaners or toothpicks to give your peeps arms.



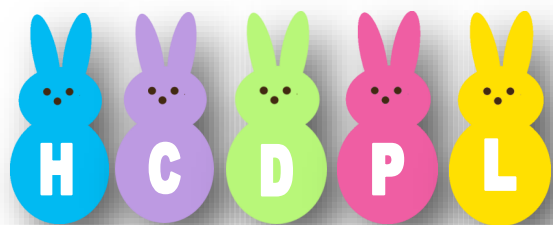
