159 EDWARD HENDERSON FAMILY

Edward and Mary Henderson were parents of nine children. After the formation of Holmes Co. in 1824, they resided in Killbuck Township, on a 160 acre farm. Their children were James, Richard, Hewitt, Ellener, June, George, Edward, Steward and Thomas.

After the death of Edward, James lived on the family farm. He was married to Susan W. Beaty on January 2, 1834. There were eleven children born to them. Many of them died as children or as young adults, which often was the case during that period.

Nathan was the eldest. He married Louisa Coleman and I know of two children; Silas and Elizabeth Henderson Hites. Nathan died at an early age. The next two sons lost their lives in the Civil War. George was mortally wounded in the shoulder at Chicasaw Bayou, Miss. Wesley was a prisoner of war from September '64 until duly exchanged. He was aboard the Steamer Sultana when the boilers exploded. He was one of the 1700 soldiers who were killed, burned or drowned when the ship sank. Isabel was born in 1840 but died at age '28

David B. was more fortunate than his older brothers. He spent over three years in the Ohio Volunteers Infantry. During the time he was in service, the young ladies of Benton wrote letters to the soldiers. As a result of this correspondence, David Henderson and Annie Nixon were married in 1867. Soon after they moved to a farm in Polk Co. Iowa. Both became homesick, the country at that time being very new and only sparsely settled. They returned to Ohio and remained there for about twenty years. In 1889 they again came to Iowa bringing three sons with them. They settled in the vicinity of Hampton, Franklin Co. David was a farmer, but also liked to deal in real estate. He purchased fine

horses and took them to the Chicago market by rail. When he retired, he built a home in Hampton near the business district. It included a dower house addition for his spinster sister, Samantha. This is an Amish word meaning separate living quarters for a family member, but joined to the main house.

The eldest son, Harry, was a school teacher in Franklin Co. He married Josie Scantlebury of Sheffield, Ia. They had one daughter. He was County Superintendent of schools for twenty-five years prior to his death in 1935. The second son, Roy, farmed a short time, but the love of horses was more intriguing. He moved to Hampton and operated a livery stable until his death at age 51. He had two daughters, Dorothy and Genevieve. The youngest son, Guy, had the wonderlust as a young man. He worked in Minneapolis awhile and then spent some time in Kansas with his uncle Samuel Henderson and family. When he returned to Hampton he took up farming and married Myrtle Staufer. He was the father of Arloene age nine and Ruth, age five when a two week illness that baffled all of the doctors, took his life.

There are no heirs in Iowa of this branch to carry on the Henderson name.
