

The room will be wired so that people with hearing aids will have clearer, overall sound with less background noise and interference. We hope patrons will utilize this new system by attending movies, lectures, computer classes, book clubs, music programs and more.

Hearing Loop switch hearing old to T-coil Also known as an induction loop, the hearing loop is an assistive listening system that helps with T-Coil equipped hearing aids. The system takes a sound source, such as a voice or a movie sound system, and transmits it directly to the user's ear thus cancelling out the ambient room noise. The system requires no extra equipment. However, two additional headsets will be available for those that need them, including those without hearing aids. By installing the Hearing Loop System, we are reinforcing our commitment to serve all the residents of Holmes County. If you haven't been to the Holmes County Library in a while, you don't know what you're missing!
