

Great news for all genealogists—The Family Search microfilms can now be ordered directly from the site. The film ordering website is located at https://www.familysearch.org/films. Patrons can create a personal account and select the preferred Affiliate Library (or family history center) where the films they order will be sent. They can make the payment of \$5.50 for renting the film using a credit or debit card, or by PayPal. 
